Please note that classrooms will open at 8:45 a.m. daily. Early Drop Off Supervision (Morning Club) is available for *Junior Infants – 4<sup>th</sup> Form* for a nominal fee daily. Students are supervised in the canteen from 7:45 a.m. until 8:45 a.m. each morning. All pupils up to and including 4<sup>th</sup> Form must avail of Early Drop Off Supervision (Morning Club) if they arrive before 8:45 a.m. Please see more information below.

Please ensure that your child brings all of their schoolbooks and stationery with them on the first day of school. All items including jackets, jumpers, water bottles, books etc. should be <u>clearly labelled with student's name and class</u>.

Up to date information including all After-School Activities (ASAs) and costs will be sent to you in August. Parents will sign up during weeks 1 and 2 of the school year and ASAs will begin in week 3. In September we will also host our 'Meet the Teacher' event which will give all parents an opportunity to meet their child's new teacher, ask questions and chat.

### St. Conleth's Morning Club and After-School Care

#### Morning Club

Morning club runs from the school canteen every morning from 7.45a.m. until 8.45a.m for students from Junior Infants to 4<sup>th</sup> Form. Students are supervised by Ms. Cecilia Franken, our After-School Coordinator, and encouraged to partake in social, relaxing and stimulating activities such as board games, arts and crafts, reading and chess. All activities run on a rotation and students are encouraged to explore, interact, and have fun. Students are then accompanied to their classrooms at 8.45a.m. for morning registration.

Morning Club is €500 annually or €5 per day. All fees are payable in advance through the Easy Payment Plus tab on our school website.

#### After-School Care

After-school Care takes place in the Junior School classrooms, Canteen and playground every school day from end of day until 6.00p.m. and is available for students from Junior Infants to 6<sup>th</sup> Form.

**Junior and Senior Infants:** Mon - Thurs: 1.45p.m. - 6.00p.m. Fri: 1.30p.m. - 6.00p.m.

**1st Form – 6th Form:** Mon – Thurs: 2.45p.m. – 6.00p.m. Fri: 2.30p.m. – 6.00p.m.

During this time students are given opportunities to spend their time relaxing, socialising, completing homework activities, baking and cooking, and spending time in both indoor and outdoor settings. Students are offered an afternoon snack (sandwich and fruit) and are encouraged to refill their water bottle throughout the afternoon. The aim of After-School Care is to replicate and extend the home environment so that students can feel relaxed, supported and stimulated.
