**School Timings:**

Please note that classrooms will open at 8:45 a.m. daily. Morning Club is available for a nominal fee daily. Students are supervised in the canteen from 7:45 a.m. until 8:45 a.m. each morning. All pupils must avail of Early Drop Off Supervision/Morning Club if they arrive before 8:45 a.m.

# St. Conleth's Morning Club and After-School Care

## Morning Club

Morning club runs from the school canteen every morning from 7.45a.m. until 8.45a.m for students from Junior Infants to 4<sup>th</sup> Form. Students are supervised by Ms. Cecilia Franken, our After-School Coordinator, and encouraged to partake in social, relaxing and stimulating activities such as board games, arts and crafts, reading and chess. All activities run on a rotation and students are encouraged to explore, interact, and have fun. Students are then accompanied to their classrooms at 8.45a.m. for morning registration.

Morning Club is **€500 annually** or **€5 per day**. All fees are payable in advance through the *Easy Payment Plus* tab on our school website.

## After-School Care

After-school Care takes place in the Junior School classrooms, Canteen and playground every school day from end of day until 6.00p.m. and is available for students from Junior Infants to 6<sup>th</sup> Form.

*Junior and Senior Infants:*    *Mon - Thurs: 1.45p.m. – 6.00p.m.*    *Fri: 1.30p.m. – 6.00p.m.*

*1<sup>st</sup> Form – 6<sup>th</sup> Form:*    *Mon - Thurs: 2.45p.m. – 6.00p.m.*    *Fri: 2.30p.m. – 6.00p.m.*

During this time students are given opportunities to spend their time relaxing, socialising, completing homework activities, baking and cooking, and spending time in both indoor and outdoor settings. Students are offered an afternoon snack (sandwich and fruit) and are encouraged to refill their water bottle throughout the afternoon. The aim of After-School Care is to replicate and extend the home environment so that students can feel relaxed, supported and stimulated.

## St. Conleth's College No Smart Device Voluntary Code

Dear Parents/Guardians,

You may be aware from news coverage that schools across the country have introduced a 'No Smart Device Voluntary Code' for parents of children in primary schools. The JSPA, in conjunction with school management, are proposing that St. Conleth's Junior School would consider such an initiative.

### OVERVIEW

In summary this initiative asks parents to agree not to purchase a Smart Device (Watch or Phone) for their child while they are in the Junior School.

### WHY A NEED FOR THIS STEP?

There is a growing body of research on the negative effects which unsupervised access to the internet and social media sites may have on children under the age of 14 years. See for example the CyberSafe Kids Annual Report 2021/2022.

Concerns include exposure to pornography; negative/vile attitudes based on difference of any kind (gender, sexual orientation, race etc.); inappropriate sharing of photos; cyber-bullying; and distress. We would query whether it is a positive experience for children in the Junior School to be on social media sites - noting that the age of consent for these sites is in any event typically 13. A decision was made in September 2023 in our Secondary School which involves students 'bagging' their phone/watch in lockable pouches for the school day. After 6 months of implementation, feedback from the school management is entirely positive. We believe that this is a timely initiative which will help to protect children from the potentially negative sides of the internet and social media.

### THE VOLUNTARY CODE - KEY POINTS

The initiative offers parents/guardians the opportunity to enter a collective agreement not to purchase a Smartphone/watch for their child until they are finished in Junior School. This can reduce peer pressure to have a phone/watch and provide parents and guardians with peer support when responding to a child's requests for a Smartphone/watch. It is not intended that the initiative would preclude parents or guardians from providing a child with a "regular" mobile phone/watch which has no internet access, for communication/personal safety reasons.

Finally, we recognise and respect that parents and guardians may have different views in relation to this initiative and re-emphasise that the initiative is entirely voluntary.
